RULES FOR 1899.

- 1.—Each Exhibitor must deliver to the Secretary (Mr. J. McAdoo, Lough Rynn), on or before Aug. 12th, 4 p.m., a List of Articles he intends to exhibit.
- 2.—Vegetables, Fruit, and Garden Flowers must be grown by the Exhibitor. Anyone infringing this Rule will be excluded from future Shows.
- 3.—No Exhibitor's name must appear on any Exhibit. When each entry is made the Secretary will supply a numbered card, which must be attached to the Exhibit.
- 4.—Exhibitors who have taken Prizes in Classes 1 or 3 will be debarred for two years from taking Prizes in the same Class.
- 5.—Garden Flowers, and Wild Flowers, and Grasses must be arranged in Stands by the Exhibitors.
- 6.—All Exhibits of Butter, Bread, and Exhibits in Class 5, must be declared to have been made solely by the Exhibitor, and all Exhibits in Class 5, must have been made within the previous twelve months. Declaration forms will be supplied by the Secretary.
- 7.—Exhibitors in the section for "Best Vegetable Marrow and best dish (1 quart) Broad Beans in Pods," Class 2, by making their entries with the Secretary on or before April 1st, can obtain gratis from

the Gardener, Mr. Lennon, Lough Rynn, Vegetable Marrow plants, and cultural directions. Residents in the Demesne, and Employees, intending to exhibit in Class 3, can, on making their entries with the Secretary on or before April 1st, obtain packets of Seeds, gratis, and cultural directions.

- 8.—All Exhibits in classes 2, 4, and 5 (except Apiaries, Bees, and Butter), must be delivered at Lough Rynn, on Thursday, Aug. 31st, not later than 4 p.m.
- 9.—In class 6, all Pigs, Calves, and Donkeys exhibited must have been the bona fide property of the Exhibitor during at least 3 months previous to the Show.
- 10.—Exhibits that are for Sale must be priced by the Exhibitor.
- 11.—No Exhibitor may take more than Three Prizes inclusive of Class 1.
- 12.—The Judges shall have power to withhold any Prize should the Exhibits not be of sufficient number and merit.
- 13.—The Prizes will be distributed at 5 p.m. Successful Competitors should attend and receive their Prizes in person.
- 14.—No Exhibits may be taken away on the day of the Show, except those in Class 6, which must be removed between 6-30 and 7-30 p.m., on that day.

If any residents in the neighbourhood will, to increase the interest of the Show, oblige the Committee by lending Fancy Needlework, or Curiosities of any description, which have not previously been exhibited at Lough Rynn, the Secretary will receive them at the Estate Office, Lough Rynn, on Aug. 30th.
